This week is, Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori, and there are numerous activities happening around the school to encourage us all to use Te Reo whenever we can. Next Tuesday we will be holding a pōwhiri to welcome new whanau to KNS and on Wednesday, some of our children will be taking part in the pōwhiri to open the Normal and Model Schools Association Conference. A huge thank you to Wilhelmina Wooff, Adrienne Troughton and Hemi Prime for the great work they have done to promote and focus our commitment to Te Reo and Tikanga Maori.

We currently have a number of our children competing at the AIMS games in Tauranga. Over 11,500 Year 7 & 8 children from 368 schools are taking part. KNS has entered a Futsal Team and two individual competitors. Thank you to the parents of these children for enabling this to happen.

On Sunday, Joe produced a stunning performance in winning the Year 7 Boys Cross Country at the games. There were a 178 quality runners in the field and in the photo taken as Joe is crossing the finish line, there is 'daylight' between him and the second place-getter. Congratulations Joe, performances like this come on the back of a lot of training, hard work and focus, a thoroughly well-deserved result.



Kiss and Drop Zone

As you may be aware we operate the Kiss and Drop zone to ensure that children get out of cars safely and that traffic flows smoothly along Donald St at the busy time between 8.30am and 8.55am.

- The Kiss & Drop zone occupies four car-parks outside the main entrance to school on Donald Street - you can recognise the zone by the orange cones and adults in high visibility vests/coats.
- Parents and caregivers are invited to drive into one of the 4 car-parks, an adult will open your car door and assist your children out of the car with their school bags and direct them to the school entrance. The driver can then drive away leaving the space free for the next family.
- The Kiss & Drop zone operates from 8.30am - 8.55am daily.

The designated Kiss and Drop zone is only for pick up and drop off from; 8.30am – 9.00am and 2.45pm – 3.30pm, Mondays – Fridays during school terms. If you need to stop and park please ensure that you park elsewhere at these times. Please also respect the parent volunteers if they ask you to move on if you are parked inappropriately.

The Board of Trustees were presented with the 2019 Karori Normal Achievement data in the last meeting to track progress of Goal 1 of the Charter.

Goal 1 - Every Child's Achievement Grows (Learning)

Whāinga 1 - Ka Tipu Ake te Paetae o ia Ākonga, ia Ākonga (Te Akoranga)

In our Charter we have set out to maintain a high level of progress and achievement in reading, writing and mathematics. Targets have been based on the 2018 End of Year data and teams implement plans to achieve these during the year. At KNS we believe student achievement will be enhanced by all children's social, emotional, physical and academic learning needs being catered for.

The goal set by the Board of Trustees for reading, writing and mathematics is that 90% of children are meeting or exceeding the expected New Zealand Curriculum level (NZC). Individual student progress and achievement against the New Zealand Curriculum is communicated to parents and whānau in the middle of the year and at the end of the year through reports.

We are very pleased again this year with the overall achievement at mid-year in reading, writing and mathematics across all years and cohorts. We are maintaining a high level of progress in reading, writing and mathematics and have currently met our end of year target where 90% of children are meeting or exceeding the expected NZC level.

Our teachers are sustaining strong programmes and implementing many strategies to continue to maintain and improve progress for our children. The overall achievement data shows our children continue to do well in relation to the curriculum level expectations supported by the Universal Design for Learning (UDL) framework.

The achievement is determined by teacher judgements that are made from a variety of work and evidence, these judgements are supported by norm referenced assessments.

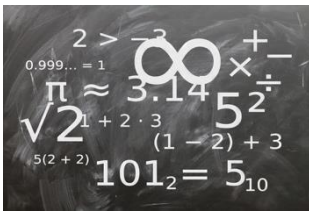

On Thursday the 29th of August the following students represented KNS at the NIWA Science Fair Competition at Victoria University.
