BOT News

Summary of 18 November 2020 BoT meeting

The KNS Board met on 18 November. Conrad relayed staff feedback on the draft Charter goals. The next step in the Charter process will be the development of actions which reflect the intent of the goals. The actions will be shared and discussed at the December Board meeting.

The Board also talked about property issues, including the school's capital works project. Now that the Ministry of Education has confirmed that the senior block will be demolished, architects Stephenson & Turner are working on more detailed design plans. The Board also discussed tenders for replacing the astroturf, which should hopefully take place in Term 1 of 2021.

The Board also discussed other topics, including the KNS enrolment scheme (zoning). The Board agreed to retain the current scheme without amendment, as Board members consider there is an ongoing need for a scheme to prevent overcrowding at the school.

The Board will meet for the final time in 2020 on 9 December, at 6.30pm in the staffroom. The agenda for the meeting will be published on the school's website a day or two before the meeting. Board meetings are open to the public.
